Youth Symphony

Our most advanced ensemble with strings, woodwinds, brass, and percussion. At least three years of ensemble playing experience are recommended.

Wind Ensemble

For woodwind and brass players seeking pre-orchestral performance skills and wind-section experience. Students must have at least two years of playing experience and know a minimum of four scales.

Flute Choir

Open to intermediate and advanced flute students. This unique ensemble may also include piccolo, alto, and bass flutes.

Sinfonia

Our intermediate string orchestra for students who are shifting (violin/viola: 3rd position; cello: 2nd position) and have at least two years of ensemble experience.

Strings

Our entry-level ensemble for string players who can read music and have at least one year of playing experience.

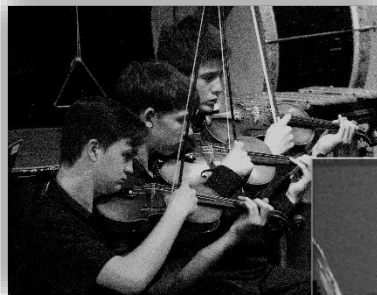
